
Symbols from TrueType Fonts

DID YOU KNOW... you can use glyphs (characters and symbols) in TrueType fonts for point symbols in vector, shape, or CAD objects?

What Symbols from TrueType Fonts Give You

- Predefined symbol shapes that you can use alone or in combination
- Access to glyphs in any TrueType font in your system
- Multicolor symbols from glyphs that have multiple shapes
- Editable shapes that can be easily modified
- Symbols that are more scaleable than bitmap point symbols



How Symbols from TrueType Fonts Work

- In the Point Symbol Editor, choose the Open TrueType Symbol option from the Pattern menu.
- Select a TrueType symbol font (such as the Webdings font in Windows98) and an appropriate glyph.
- Select colors and turn on fill for the component shapes. Alter layer order of shapes as needed to show all interior polygons.
- Use the Paste TrueType Symbol menu option to add additional glyphs (such as numerals) to build up complex symbols.
